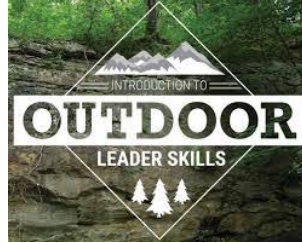


## Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation (BALOO)
