NRA Rifle Instructor Course (1/17-18, continuing 1/24-25)

This 25 hour course completes all requirements to become an NRA Rifle Instructor. The training includes both classroom and range

time. Students will complete a basic instructor training (BIT), basics of rifle shooting and rifle instructor training. Students must complete all sections to become certified.

NOTE: This course is not for Cub Scout leaders who want to be certified as Cub BB gun range masters.
